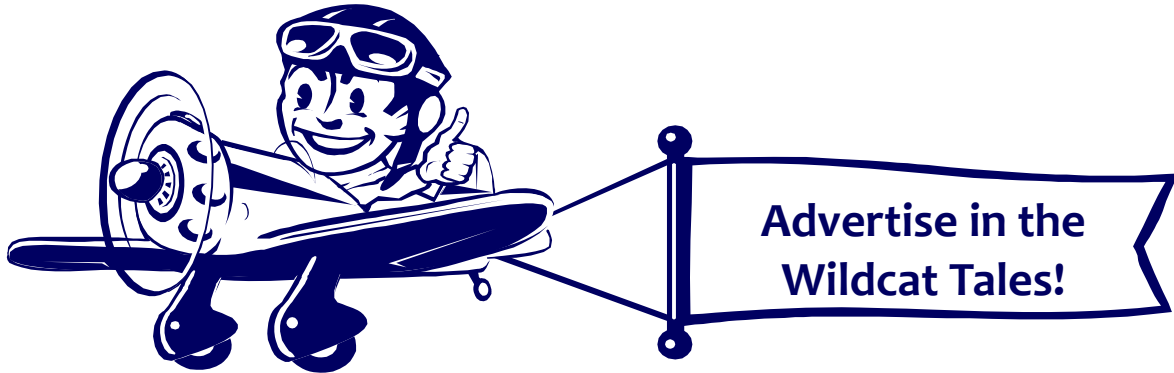

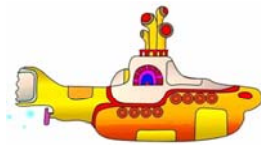

Dress Code

As temperatures rise, it's a good time to review the district dress code for elementary students.

Per the "PUSD Student and Parent Elementary School Handbook", Dress Code p. 11:

- Halter tops, tube tops, spaghetti strapped shirts may not be worn.
- Clothing that allows for the display of underclothing is not appropriate.
- If shorts are worn, they must be appropriate and modest in length. Students who wear shorts considered too short will be required to change.
- Shirts should be full length and made of opaque material. Students who wear shirts that do not fully cover their midriff or are too low will be required to change.
- Pajamas, slippers and boxers are not appropriate attire.
- Students who violate the dress code will be required to change to appropriate attire in compliance with the dress code or be picked up from school by their parents.

Frontier Volunteers of the Year

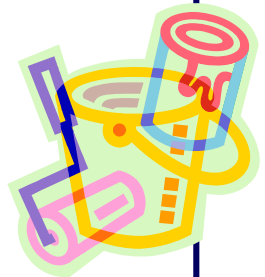
